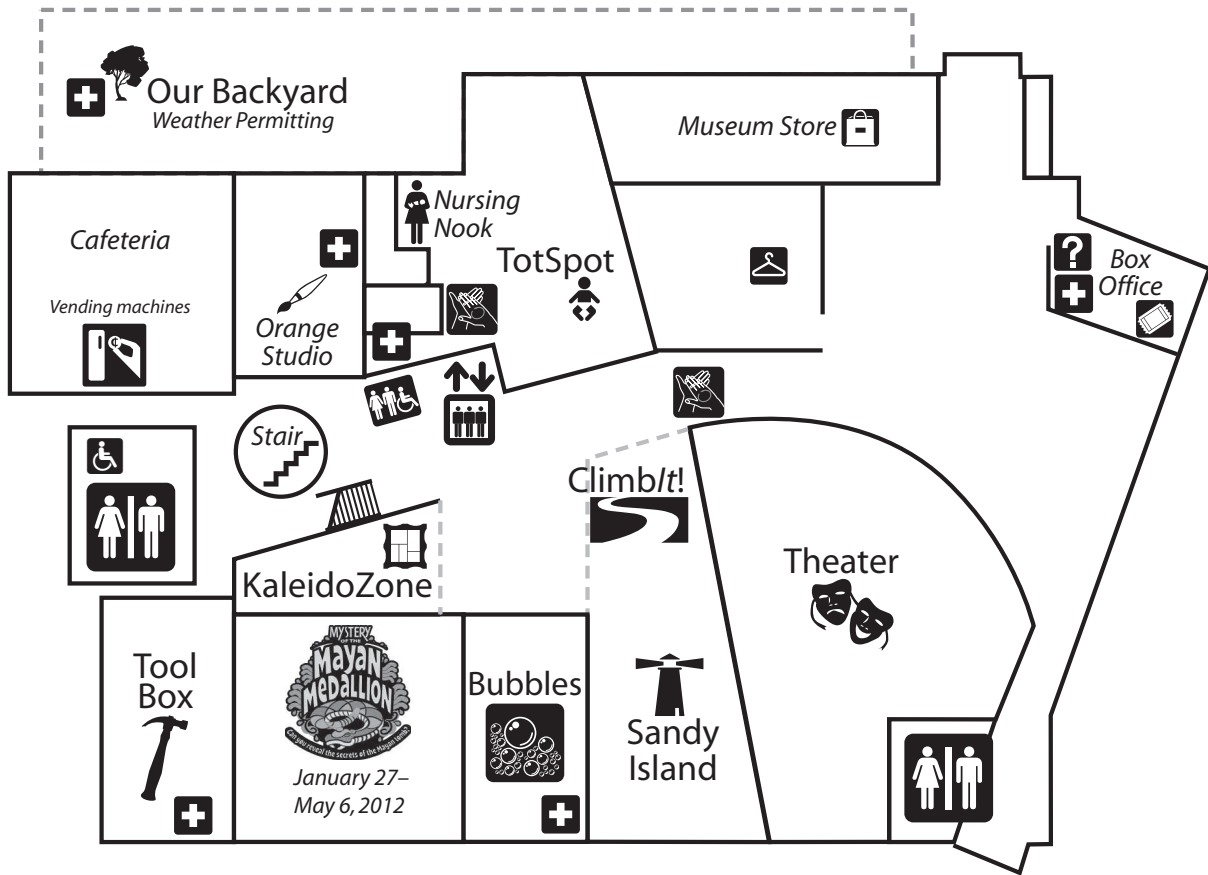
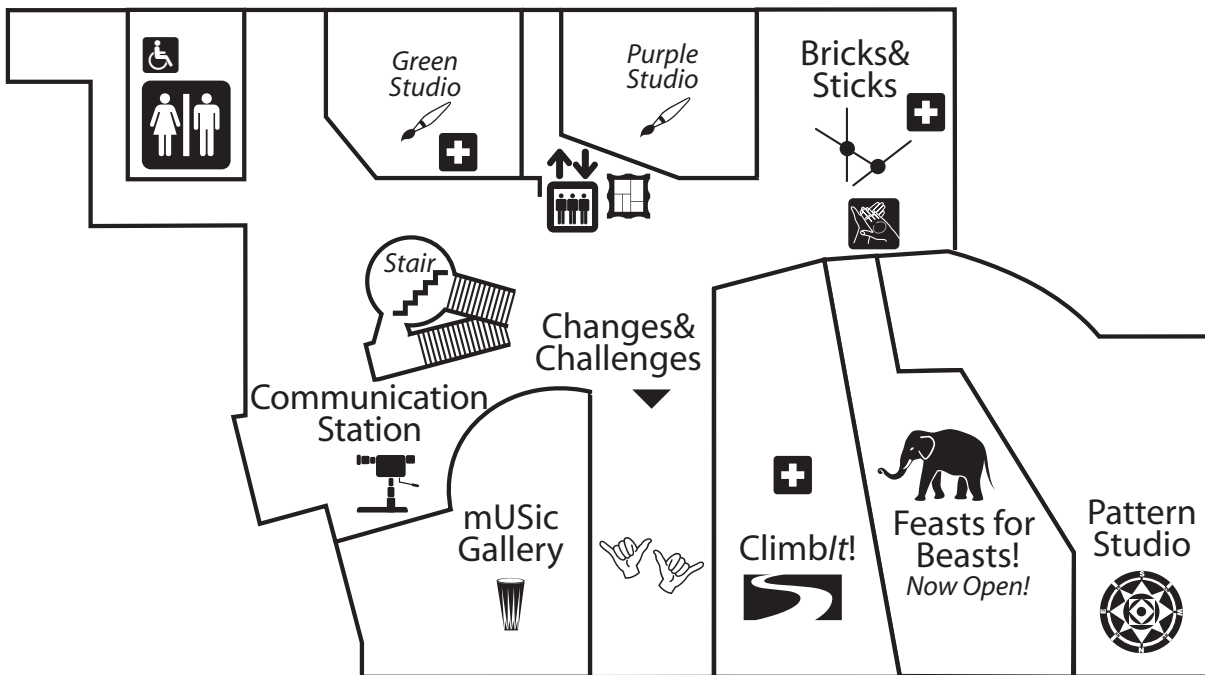

**TO ENSURE YOUR ENJOYMENT,  
AS WELL AS THE ENJOYMENT OF OTHERS:**

- Adults must be accompanied by children.
- Children are to be attended at all times.
- Food is to be confined to the cafeteria. Vending machines are available for your convenience.
- Strollers and stools should not be placed next to railings on the second floor.
- Climblt: for your child's safety, children must be over the age of four and at least 42" tall.
- A hand stamp may be obtained to exit the museum and return later today.
- Bathroom facilities contain infant changing stations.

- All museum facilities are accessible to people with disabilities.

**THE MYSTERY OF THE MAYAN MEDALLION**

Get a taste of what it's like to be an archeologist as you join in a treasure quest and immerse yourself in the Maya culture.

**BUBBLES**

This interactive sensory experience will naturally involve and excite small children.

**SANDY ISLAND**

Enjoy play in sand table, explore sand shakers and manipulate the sand maker.

**TOTSPOT**

This enclosed play space is our favorite place for families with children under four. Our youngest visitors can enjoy both active and dramatic play.

**COMMUNICATION STATION**

Young children enjoy talking on our telephones, listening to sound effects and seeing themselves on television. There are several "movie making" manipulative components that a preschooler can master.

**MUSIC GALLERY**

The ability to beat a drum and make music on our other percussion instruments will excite and captivate our youngest visitors. With assistance small children can create visual images in our "feeling music" room.

**CHANGES AND CHALLENGES**

Encourage children to rely on alternative senses when exploring how people learn differently. They can find food in the kitchen based on their sense of smell, match clothing using their sense of touch and "see" the doorbell ring. Our sensory room naturally soothes and creates quiet time for children of all ages.

**FEASTS FOR BEASTS**

Discover the amazing ways that animals find and eat their food. View live animals and interact with artifacts to take a bite out of scientific discovery.

**BRICKS & STICKS**

The block building table in this gallery was specifically designed for parents and young children to create block structures together.

**PATTERN STUDIO**

Identifying, recognizing and creating patterns are important early math skills. Children can see people patterns in the mirrors, design and tile a floor, continue a mason's pattern with bricks and arrange petals on a flower.
